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Course: Graphic Design

Materials: Students will use computers/iPads for their daily projects. Occasionally they will check out cameras. No additional materials will be needed.

Goals/Objectives: As always students will be working to achieve competence in the skills in art/instructional technology as set forth by the state of Missouri. Students will be gaining skill and competence in graphic design career techniques. Students will have a wide range of experiences with technology and a foundation of career skills upon graduation.

Deadlines: Work will be expected on my desk on the day it is due; however, unlike some subjects it can be very difficult to set a due date on creative projects. As we work day to day on projects our schedule will change accordingly. This class will have some projects with more strict due dates due to our deadlines with producing the yearbook. I expect consistent and rigorous work ethic for projects. School re-assessment policy will be followed when possible.

Assignments: Students will complete a variety of activities from "hands-on" projects, viewing presentations graphic design related themes, reading, writing, or even research projects.

Evaluation: Students will be evaluated in many ways including but not limited to: work ethic, appropriate use of technology, creativity, ability to follow directions, as well as specific computer skills. Skills assessed will tie directly to the standards created by the state department of education. These grading criteria are designed to give all students equal opportunity to achieve regardless of talent. Most projects will be graded with the use of a scoring guide. Typically scoring guides will be posted in the Google Classroom when projects are assigned as to ensure that students have the best opportunity possible to be successful.
